



WSSC is sponsoring the Port-to-Port feeder race on Saturday and join the Cedar Island Yacht Club Labour Day Regatta on Sunday.

**WSSC will sponsor a Potluck (Bring a Dish to Pass) Breakfast on Monday morning, September 3, 2007, open to all.**

The Port to Port course is from the WSSC "N" buoy, leave the Grecian Shoal mark to port, and finish between the West Break Wall at Cedar Beach Creek, and an orange tetrahedron placed about 300 meters south of the Cedar Beach Creek West Break Wall.

The entrance to Cedar Beach Creek is marked by green and red buoys. The water is deeper in the center of the channel. Boats drafting 7 feet or less should have no problem.

Only boats racing the CIYC Labor Day race are to dock at the Cedar Island Yacht Club slips. Others are welcome to dock at the public docks on the canal just prior to the bridge. All dockage is first come first serve (no reservations). There may be a charge at the public docks (hasn't been in many years), but there is only about 4' of water in the public docks. Larger boats can dock on the North wall of the public docks, or if racing on Sunday on the wall by the CIYC gin pole.

Vessels arriving from the U.S. must call Canadian Customs upon landing in Canada. Cedar Beach is a reporting station. Please be courteous to others requiring use of the phone. **No personal calls.**

It is suggested that skippers and crew returning to the U.S. procure a U.S. INS form I-68 or Nexus (see website at [www.ccrca.gc.ca/nexus](http://www.ccrca.gc.ca/nexus)) prior to departing the U.S. These are available at U.S. Immigrations offices (Detroit side of the Windsor tunnel, Ambassador Bridge and Blue Water Bridge among others).

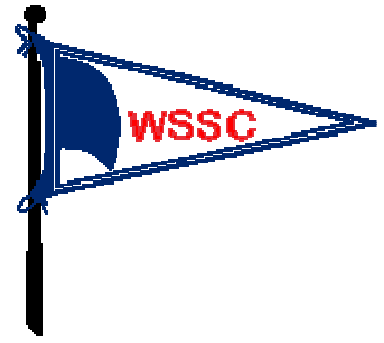
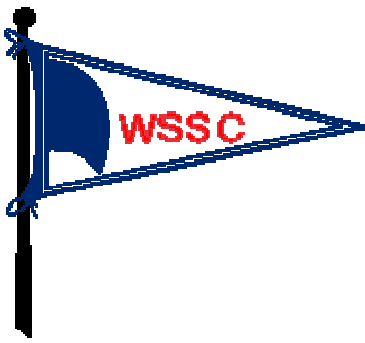

**SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

**1. Rules**

The Race will be governed by the rules as defined in the current *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS) and the rules as prescribed by their rating rule (PHRF-LE or MORC), except as modified by this program

**2. Notices to Competitors**

Notices to Competitors will be forwarded by e-mail, posted at the West Shore Sail Club website (<http://www.WestShoreSailClub.org>), posted at the Ford Yacht Club, Grosse Ile Yacht Club, and others as appropriate.

**3. Changes to Sailing Instructions**

Changes to Sailing Instructions will be posted before 0900 the day it will take effect on the bulletin boards outside the front entrances to Grosse Ile Yacht Club and front door of Ford Yacht Club. Changes will also be broadcast by the race committee boat or the race chairman's boat on VHF Channel **71** prior to the first race signals.

**4. Schedule of Races**

4.1 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first class of the race is 0955 hours

**5. Classes**

5.1 Classes will be provided for PHRF Spinnaker, and PHRF JAM (jib and main) / Cruising Classes.

5.2 \*\*The Cruising Class is intended for skippers and crews that are not active racing sailors. At the discretion of the Race Committee, boats applying for the Cruising Class may be assigned to the JAM class.

**6. Class Flags**

Classes will start in the following order:

**7. Racing Area**

The Port-to-Port Race will race from the Bar Point Area, south of Amherstburg, to Cedar Beach, Ontario, Canada.

**8. The Course**

The course is from the WSSC "N" mark (approx 42° 02.4 N, 83° 07.6 W). Proceed so as to pass the Grecian Shoal Mark to port. Then proceed to pass between the Cedar Beach Creek Break Wall. and an orange tetrahedron located south of the Cedar Beach Creek Western Break Wall (42° 00.7' N, 82° 46.5' W).

**9. Marks**

9.1 The race will be sailed using the WSSC "N" buoy, the government Grecian Shoal buoy, and the Cedar Beach Creek Western Break Wall and an orange tetrahedron south of the Cedar Beach Creek Western Break Wall.

9.2 The WSSC "N" buoy is a cylindrical form, white in color with orange reflective tape around the identification letter, and additional orange marking as required.

A temporary orange tetrahedron will be placed approximately 300 meters south of the West Break Wall at the entrance to Cedar Beach Creek.

**10. The Start**

10.1 Races will be started using Rule 26 with the warning signal given 5 minutes before the starting signal.

10.2 The starting line will be between the mast of the committee boat, or a staff displaying an orange flag or shape on the race committee boat, and the 'N' buoy approximately fifty meters from the committee boat.

10.3 Boats whose starting signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area.

**11 Recalls**

The Race Committee will hail the sail numbers of On the Course Side (OCS) boats after the starting signal. The failure of any boat to hear the hail, the hail of some but not all OCS boats, the untimely hail of some or all OCS boats or failure to hail any or all boats shall not be grounds for granting redress. The skipper of each boat is ultimately responsible to determine if his yacht has crossed the line early. This changes RRS 29.2

**12. The Finish**

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Western Break Wall to the entrance to Cedar Beach Creek and an orange tetrahedron placed approximately 300 meters south of the Western Break Wall to Cedar Beach Creek.

### 13. Penalty System

The penalty for a boat that has broken a rule of part 2 while racing is the boat must take the penalty as soon as practical after the time of the incident. Her penalty shall be a one turn, (360°) penalty. However if she caused serious damage or gained a significant advantage in the race by her breach she shall retire. This changes RRS rule 44.1 and 44.2.

### 14. Time Limit

Boats in each class finishing more than 90 minutes after the first boat that sails the course finishes may be scored DNF. This changes RRS rule 35.

### 15. Protests and Requests for Redress

15.1 A boat intending to protest about an incident that occurs in the racing area shall notify the finishing race committee of her intention, including the sail number of the boat(s) being protested. This is in addition to RRS 61.1(a).

15.2 For each class, the protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last boat has finished.

15.3 Notices will be posted within 30 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be heard in the clubhouse at the time posted.

### 16. Scoring

The *Low-Point Scoring System* will apply

### 17. Safety Regulations

17.1 All competitors in WSSC Races are encouraged to wear, while on the water, other than brief periods while adding or removing clothing, an approved PFD (US Coast Guard or Canadian).

17.2 A boat retiring from a race shall notify a Race Committee before leaving the course, or, when that is not possible, a Race Committee member immediately after arrival ashore. The race committees will monitor VHF channel **71** to the extent possible.

### 18. Prizes

WSSC Flags will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in each class as appropriate, dependent on the number of starters. Flags will be presented at the CIYC clubhouse commencing at 5:30 P.M, or as soon thereafter as is fit. Classes may be split for the purpose of giving awards if sufficient entries are received.

### 19. WSSC Boat of the Year

West Shore Sail Club will award Boat of the Year trophies to the boat in PHRF, and JAM classes accumulating the best point record using the Cox-Sprague scoring system from the following races:

The WSSC Regatta may be counted twice. Only the best 11 of the 22 counter races are applied to the BOAT OF THE YEAR scoring. If any of the counter races are not held, an additional WNATR race may be substituted as a counter for boat of the year. You must be a member of WSSC prior to the WSSC Regatta to qualify for WSSC Boat of the Year Awards.

The safety of a yacht and its crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the skipper. It shall be the complete and unlimited responsibility of each skipper to decide whether to start, continue, or finish a race. Skippers must be a member of a yacht or sail club, or other organization affiliated with a national sailing authority. Crews who are competent and physically fit to face adverse conditions shall man all boats.

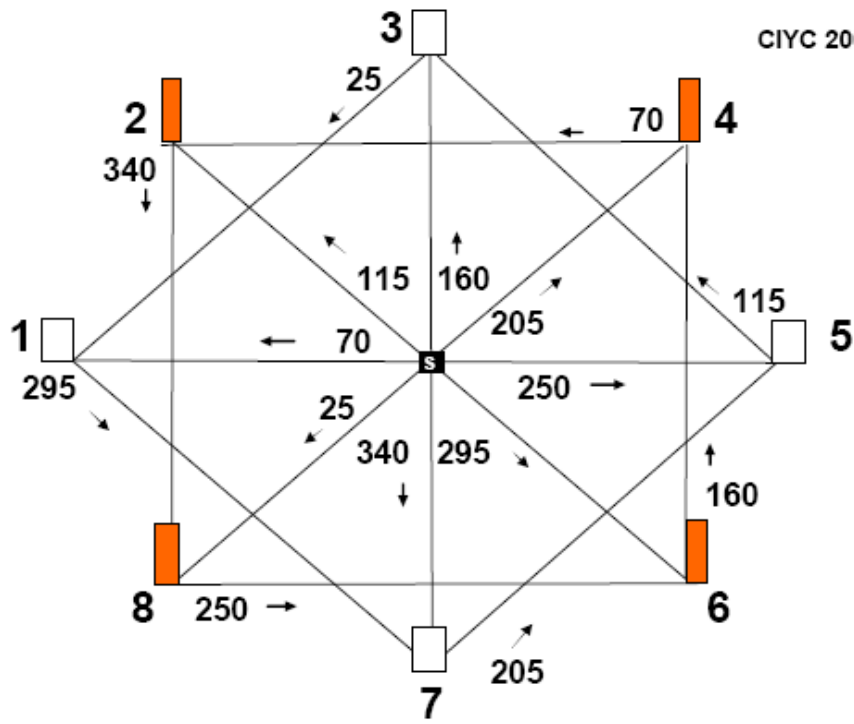

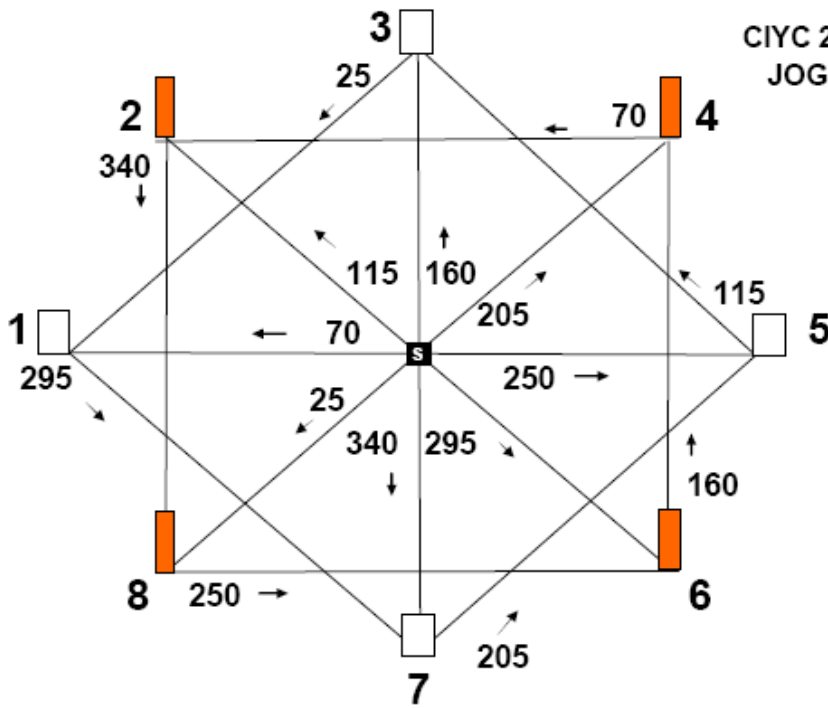
